Home Preparation Checklist



Good pictures are crucial marketing tools for selling a home. It begins with a home professionally photographed as an important part of effective marketing. Homeowners and Realtors® depend on high-quality, high-resolution images not just to sell the home, but to sell it at a higher price, sooner.

I will be photographing both the inside and outside of your home. I'll be photographing all of the major rooms. We normally do not photograph the garage unless it has special features (finished or has a heater).

If you have special features of your home that are not obvious, please let me know to be sure I include them in the shoot.

Key Advice: De-Clutter and De-Personalize!

The goal is to enable potential buyers to project themselves into the home.

Remember that you are selling the room and not the furniture.
